AIR TRANSPORTATION/RULES - Round trip economy class jet airfare with Delta Airlines.

LUGGAGE - Allowed free of charge to your first overseas destination and from most points of return to the U.S.A., 1 bag per person plus a carry on – This may change by departure time.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS - Hotels featured in this tour are 4-star and first class. All rooms are twin bedded with private bath and the tour price is based on two people sharing one room. Anyone occupying a room as a single will be charged a single supplement. The cruise is for an inside cabin, double occupancy. If anyone desires an outside cabin or a single cabin, this request can be made to us, and if available, then extra fees will be charged accordingly. The judgment pertaining to the classification of hotels reflects only the opinion of the tour operator as to comparative desirability.

TRANSFERS - Transportation of passengers and luggage is provided on arrival and departure from airports to and from hotels and is included in the tour cost when traveling with the main tour party.

OUR ITINERARY

MAY 07 FRI Departure from USA

Our pilgrimage begins as we depart the USA on our international overnight flight to Greece.

MAY 08 SAT Arrive in Thessalonica

With our arrival in Thessalonica, we have entered into the world of the New Testament where Paul and his companions established the first Christian communities throughout his four missionary journeys. On arrival, we will be met at the airport for a transfer to our hotel. Dinner and overnight in Thessalonica.

MAY 09 SUN Thessalonica/Philippi/Kavala (Neapolis)

Begin the day in the port of Kavala (Neapolis in the Bible—Acts 16:11) where the Apostle Paul first landed with his disciples, Timothy and Silas, to bring the Gospel to Europe during his second missionary journey. This port was also a destination for Luke when we sailed from Troas. See a Byzantine castle, the Roman Aqueduct and the ruins of an acropolis. Follow the Via Egnatia, a remnant of Rome's highway system, viewing Roman and Greek tombs and ruts of ancient chariot wheels. Next, stop in Philippi, where Paul preached his first evangelical sermon and baptized the very first Christian convert on European soil (Lydia). Among the ruins located on the rocky ledge above the town's main road is the prison into which Paul and Silas were thrown. It was in Philippi that Octavian and Anthony defeated Brutus and Cassius in 42 BC. Return to Thessalonica to explore the ancient city where Paul planted a church that would later receive two New Testament epistles. View one of the most beautiful basilicas in the City, St. Demetrius. Continue along the waterfront to the massive White Tower and nearby triumphal Arch of Galerius. Dinner and overnight in Thessalonica.

MAY 10 MON Thessalonica/Berea/Vergina/Kalambaka

We begin the day by going to Berea, known for its numerous Byzantine

and post-Byzantine churches (about 48 surviving today and 72 originally), resulting in the name of a "Small Jerusalem," as well as a unique collection of Byzantine icons. Particularly famous is the Church of the Resurrection. In Berea, we will also stop to see the mosaic monument commemorating Paul's preaching and where "Jews and some honorable Greeks accepted the new faith of Christianity." (Acts 17:10-12). On our way to Kalambaka, we will visit King Phillip II of Macedon's tomb in Vergina; he was the king of the ancient kingdom of Macedonia from 359 BC until his death in 336 BC. He was a member of the Argead dynasty, the founder of the ancient kingdom, and the father of Alexander the Great. Arrival and overnight in Kalambaka.

MAY 11 TUE Meteora/Athens

We spend some time today marveling at this unique phenomenon of nature — 24 perpendicular rocks where 600 years ago, Byzantine monks chose to worship God and build their cave-like Monastic community of Meterora. Take in the striking monasteries that crown the summits of these pinnacles with their wooden galleries and corniced rooftops. Hanging over the stunning abysses, these primitive dwellings compose one of the most fascinating sites on earth. A special treat awaits with a visit to two of these timeless monasteries to see the exquisite specimens of Byzantine art on display. After that, we drive to Athens. Overnight in Athens.

MAY 12 WED Athens/Acropolis/Mars Hill

Breakfast at the hotel, and we go to the center of Athens to start our half-day panoramic city tour of Athens, which gives you an opportunity to observe the striking contrasts that make Athens the dynamic city that it is. Then t see the Panathenaic Stadium where the first Olympic Games of modern times were held in 1896. Continue and pass the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the Hadrian's Arch, rising some 377 feet above the land below and not far from the Acropolis and Agora (the marketplace). Mars Hill served as the meeting place for the Areopagus Court, the highest court in Greece. Mars Hill is the location of one of Paul's most important Gospel presentations at the time of his visit to Athens during his second missionary journey (Acts 17:16-34). It was where he addressed the religious idolatry of the Greeks who even had an altar to the "unknown god." Then, visit the ancient Roman agora. On the Acropolis, visit the Architectural Masterpieces of the Golden Age of Athens: the Propylaea, the Temple of Athena Nike, the Erechtheion, and finally the Parthenon. Return to the hotel. Free afternoon in Athens. Overnight in Athens.

MAY 13 THUR Corinth

Depart for a full-day tour to Ancient Corinth, the city which was the center of trade for many centuries. To begin, we will stop at the famous channel, called the Isthmus in Greek, the place where the Peloponnese and central Greece meet, as well as the Aegean and Ionian Seas. The canal was completed at the end of the 19th century by the government of Charilaos Trikopis and saves ships the more than 400 kilometers it takes to go around the Peloponnese peninsula. We will visit Ancient Corinth with its amazing artifacts, some of which date back to 6000 BC. The remains of the city, which includes the agora

(market) and the temple of Apollo (6th century BC), clearly show how rich and important Corinth was in antiquity. The Romans rebuilt the City of Corinth in 44 BC to later make it the provincial capital of Greece. On our way back to Athens, we will make a brief stop at the site of the ancient port of Cenchrea, where the Apostle Paul disembarked from Thessalonica. For Christians, Corinth is mentioned in the New Testament when Paul addressed the residents of the City in his two epistles, I and II Corinthians. It is mentioned again in the Acts of the Apostles during the evangelical work of the Apostle Paul. At the end of the tour, return to Athens. Overnight in Athens.

MAY 14 FRI Start 3-night, 4 day Cruise/Mykonos

We begin the day with a drive to the Port of Lavrio and step aboard The Celestyal Discovery to start a 3-night, 4-day Greek Islands cruise. Spend the afternoon exploring the Island of Mykonos, world-renowned for its lovely windmills, small cobblestone streets and countryside. Return to the ship for dinner and overnight.

MAY 15 SAT Kusadasi/Ephesus (Turkey)/ Patmos (Greece)

Step off the ship at Kusadasi and into nearby Ephesus, Turkey, Asia Minor's greatest archaeological site. This Greek and Roman city has been remarkably preserved. Step along with the broad marble street where Paul walked. Gaze at the Temple of Artemis (Diana), the Temple of Hadrian, and The Celsius Library. Marvel at the massive theatre where Paul was opposed as he spoke boldly about Christ. In the afternoon, enjoy cruising aboard The Celestyal Discovery to the Island of Patmos, built on a mass of volcanic rock. The island marks the site where the Apostle John wrote the book of Revelation. Visit the Monastery of St. John and the cave where he was imprisoned. Return to the ship for dinner and overnight.

MAY 16 SUN Crete/Santorini

Arrive in Heraklion, Crete, the largest of the Greek islands and the cradle of the ancient Minoan Civilization. This island is where the Apostle Paul spent time as he was being transported to Rome as a prisoner and where Titus remained to help the churches there. Take a walking tour through town and stop at the Church of St. Titus, Paul's true son in the faith and the first Bishop of Crete. Continue aboard The Celestyal Discovery for an afternoon cruise to the famous island of Santorini, formed by the half-submerged crescent of a volcanic caldera. Perched atop high cliffs, savor the island's breathtaking views. Dinner and overnight on the ship.

MAY 17 MON Athens Departure/Arrive in the USA

Arrival at the Port and, after breakfast, disembarkation. Our English-speaking concierge will assist with our private transfer to the Athens Airport (ATH). We bid Greece farewell and fly home to the USA with many wonderful memories of our time in Greece and Turkey.
